Overview



- Comprehensive review of all University and Senate By-Laws pertaining to undergraduate representation.
- Collaborative effort between students, faculty, and staff from across the University.
- Series of five separate proposals to amend By-Laws to increase and refine undergraduate student representation, with a focus on regional campus participation.

Timeline



- Feb. 7th 2022: Senate Meeting (recommendation to add undergraduate seats for regional campuses)
- March 30th 2022: BOT Meeting (approval of Feb. 7th recommendation)
- April 4th 2023: Formal Notice of Review to Senate Office
- April 7th 2024: Introduction of Review to Student Leaders
- July 21st 2023: Cheryl Galli Meeting
- August 23rd 2023: First Submission to the SEC
- November 26th 2023: Student Leaders Recap
- November 27th 2023: Second Submission to the SEC
- January 5th 2024: Third Submission to the SEC
- January 12th 2024: SEC Approval
- February 5th 2024: Presentation to Senate

Major Findings



Language

- Glaring oversights in existing language e.g. there is not a single "Undergraduate Student Government," there are five.
- Overly vague description of procedures.

Negative Effects

- An entire year without regional campus Student Senators (AY 22-23).
- Lack of consultation for regional campus student leaders.
- Most, if not all, regional campus student leaders did not even know the University Senate existed.

The Role of the Senate



Proposals I-IV

- Apply only to University By-Laws
- The Senate is *recommending* the Board of Trustees take action on these proposals, as they have the final say.

Proposal V

- Applies only to University Senate By-Laws
- The Senate is voting to certify the change to By-Laws.
- Because we will be presenting and voting on the same day, approval from two-thirds of the Senate is required.

Proposal V: Senate Committee Appointments



Proposal to Senate:

Motion to recommend amending the *By-Laws, Rules, and Regulations of the University Senate*, Article I – By-Laws, Section C.3.d as follows:

Proposal V: Senate Committee Appointments



Current Language

- Gives only the Storrs USG the authority to nominate students to serve on Senate Committees.
- No mention whatsoever of regional campuses.

Proposed Language

 Gives each regional campus student government the authority to submit students for consideration to serve on Senate committees.

"... Each year, the Nominating Committee shall solicit for its consideration names of students from the Presidents of the Undergraduate Student Government of Storrs, the **Associated Student Government of** Avery Point, the Undergraduate Student Government of Hartford, the Student Government Association of Stamford, the Associated Student Government of Waterbury, and the Graduate Student Senate..."

Summary



- The goal of each proposal is not to reinvent the wheel, but to right previous wrongs and guarantee a more equitable future for student representation.
- Although reforms for graduate students
 were not included in this proposals, the
 groundwork for a future By-Law review is
 in place.
