2. Sub-Committee Reports

- a. Transgender Issues & Rights Committee
 - i. Discussed the work and documentation for the Transgender Restroom access
 - ii. Planning to roll access for disabled students rolled into documentation as well
 - iii. Planning to have the Director of the Rainbow Center come to talk to the whole committee.
 - 1. This is to ensure we are up to date on the work the Rainbow Center has been doing so we do not duplicate their work.
 - iv. Action step: ground-truth where transgender-and disabled- accessible restrooms are on campus.
 - 1. How can we can find ways to do this?
 - a. Use student labor through partners with capacity?
 - b. Draft committee members and allies to check one building?

b. Anti-Racism

- i. Discussed how states have been responding to controversial topics largely with requests for information disclosures (FOIA).

 - 2. Sub-committee discussed the mechanics of what can be done to protect academic freedom.

c. Disability

 - 2. Currently we are not set up for bi-lingual captioning.
