- 3. Interactive Presentation with Joseph Thompson, Purchasing Processes & State Laws (Part I): Joseph Thompson presented a PPT slide deck which gave an overview of issues with Procurement/Purchasing, specifically regarding turnaround times of contracts and purchases, some of the related root causes, and shared some actions their office has taken to address some of these challenges, and some future planned next steps to continue making improvements to the system, bearing in mind the need to adhere to State of CT regulations.
